

BARUCH 5:1-9

A Reading from the Book of Baruch.

Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on forever the beauty of the glory from God. Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God; put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting; for God will show your splendor everywhere under heaven. For God will give you evermore the name, "Righteous Peace, Godly Glory." Arise, O Jerusalem, stand upon the height; look toward the east, and see your children gathered from west and east at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that God has remembered them. For they went out from you on foot, led away by their enemies; but God will bring them back to you, carried in glory, as on a royal throne. THE HOLY GOSPEL

LUKE 3:1-6

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People Glory be to you, Lord Christ.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah, "The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.'"

THE NICENE CREED [an affirmation of faith]

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



THE COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

We welcome you to receive the real presence of Christ in this Holy Communion. To receive the bread, kneel or stand at the altar rail with your hands extended. To receive the wine, the historic Christian practice is drinking from the common chalice. If you are uncomfortable doing so in this season, cross your arms across your chest as the chalice passes, then take an individual cup of wine from the tray on the Nave floor. Return the empty cup to the tray located in the back as you exit. If you prefer not to drink from the chalice, we ask you to take an individual cup rather than intincting (dipping) your bread in the chalice.
